MIU PATIENT CRITERIA FOR RECEPTION TEAM

The following can be advised to attend MIU directly.

- Musculoskeletal Injuries, including shoulder dislocations. (Except direct injury to hip)
- Minor Wounds including animal and human bite.
- Foreign bodies to skin and ears.
- Minor Burns including chemical burns.
- Foreign body in eye, red or painful eye, chemical in eye.
- All finger problems including amputation and pain or swelling without injury.
- Chest wall injury: Age under 65, not on anticoagulants, undistressed, not short of breath.
- Back injury: Caused by lifting or twisting, age under 65.
 Walking.
- Head injury: No loss of consciousness, not on anticoagulants/blood thinners (eg. Apixaban, Clopidogril). Walking, well, no confusion or vomiting.
- Orthopedics expected patients who are walking and well.

Patients with problems over 14 days old should see GP unless seen in an MIU for the same injury previously. These patients should be booked into MIU.

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MIU PATIENT CRITERIA FOR RECEPTION TEAM

The following may be seen in MIU but must be triaged first in ED or discussed with an ENP in MIU Ex 23942

- Neck injury
- Eye problems with altered vision
- Cellulitis/skin infection with no wound.

The following cannot be seen MIU

- Deliberate self harm
- Nose bleeds
- Back injury caused by a fall onto back/hitting back
- Atraumatic back pain (pain without injury).
- Needlestick injury
- Unwitnessed fall in a confused or demented patient.
- Collapse or unexplained fall.
- RTC combined speed over 30mph/airbags deployed
- Bicycle collision with vehicle
- Fall from above 1m/3feet/down 5 stairs
- Intoxicated
- Limb or joint pain or swelling without injury.
